Review

1. What was the purpose of the passage? What was the author's central claim? Which questions were related to that claim?
2. What questions did you find hardest? What made them hard (e.g., the question itself, the answers, the passage, something else)?
3. What questions did you find easiest? What made them easy (e.g., the question itself, the answers, the passage, something else)?
4. Are there patterns to the question types you find harder than others? For example, did you find that general or specific are harder? What about individual question types
5. Look at each of the questions you answered incorrectly. Why was your answer wrong? What makes the correct answer right?
6. If there were charts and graphs, how did they support the author's claims? What were the independent in dependent variables?
7. If this was a paired passage, where did the authors agree? Where did they disagree?
